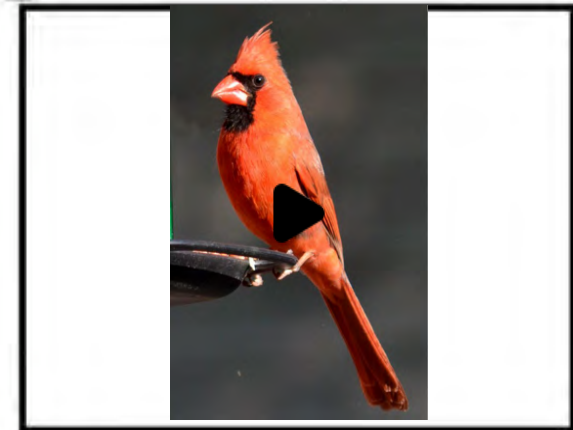

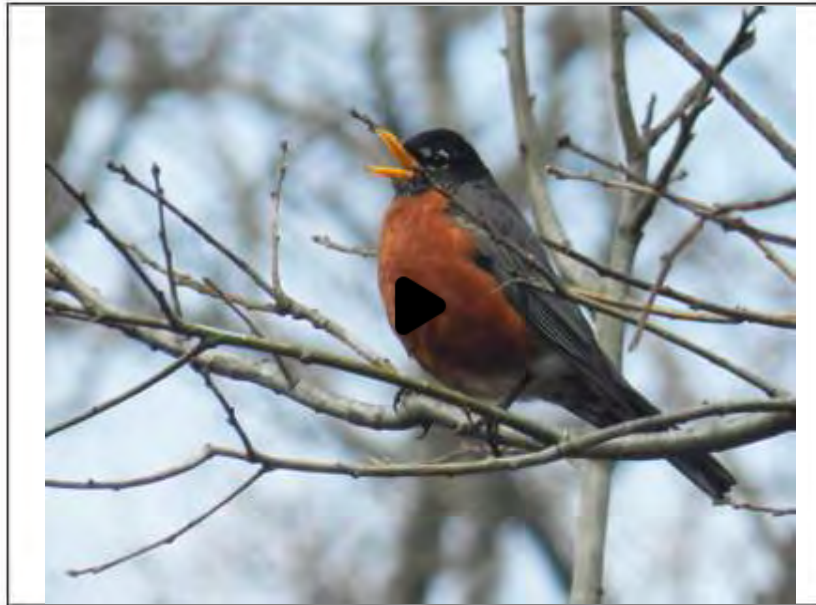

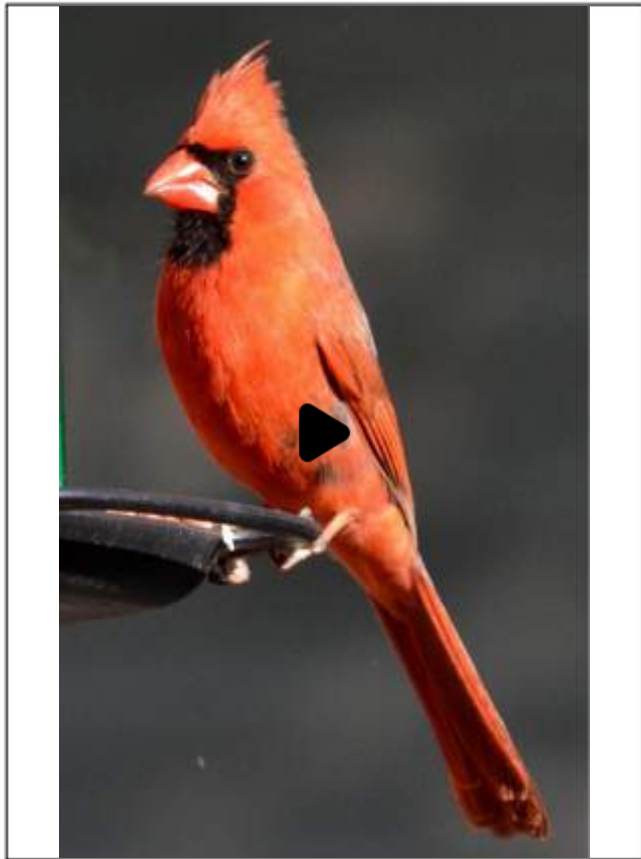
Birds are small animals that have wings and feathers. There are many different kinds of birds. They are all different sizes. This book is about four birds that we might see in our backyard.

The male cardinals are bright red and the female cardinals are light brown and gray. Northern cardinals live in swamps, gardens, and woods. A cardinal eats weeds, sunflower seeds, grains, fruits, and insects. Cardinals are helpful, friendly, and beautiful birds. The Northern Cardinal loves to sing and has 28 different songs.

Hummingbird

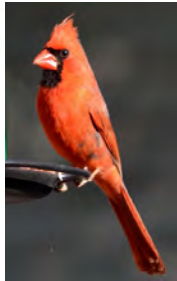

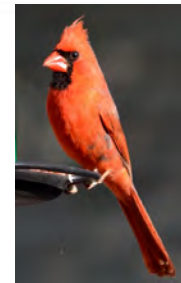

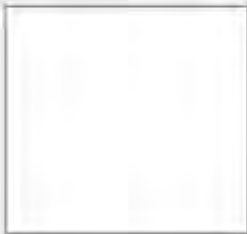
